What is an Endowed Professorial Chair?

An endowment is a legacy gift from a donor intending to provide a permanent income stream from funds held and invested in perpetuity. An endowed professorial chair is a faculty position supported by the annual revenue from the endowment. The endowment can also fund research projects and its supporting staff.

The reliable income stream provides financial stability to an institution like IBS, ensuring that we can continue to meet our mission — providing quality education for our students.

- IBS Endowed chairs sometimes reference a particular area of study. This signals our commitment to the specific area of research and education.
- IBS Endowed chairs are named for person(s) or organizations who made significant contributions to the propagation of the Dharma, creating bonds of karmic connection between IBS and our donors.
- Appointment to an endowed chair is an academic honor. It is a recognition of accomplishment, scholarship and academic performance.

LEGACY PROFESSORIAL CHAIR ENDOWMENTS

The Institute of Buddhist Studies operates with six Legacy Professorial Chair Endowments. Most of these endowments are no longer able to support a full-time faculty member. Today, a "fully-funded" professorial chair needs a minimum of \$3,000,000 to fulfill its purpose.

In 2019, the IBS Board of Trustees approved the "Legacy Professorial Chair Fund Drive", to bring each chair to full funding. In 2020, the IBS joined forces with the BCA and the BCA Endowment Foundation and folded this fund-raising drive into the comprehensive long-term development program called the Dharma Forward Campaign.
