Tantra has played an important role in the development of Asian Culture. That role, however, has either been unrecognized or marginalized for a long time. On the one hand, the negative image of Tantra held by many Western scholars for almost a century has no doubt copntributed to an avoidance of associating one's subject with the Tantric tradition. On the other hand, scholars untrained in Tantra are all too likely to fail to recognize its presence or influence. These external reasons for the lack of study are matched by internal reasons, e.g., the esoteric and antinomian quality of Tantra.
