**Overview**: An introduction to the language of the Pāli Tipiṭaka.

Our textbook is A.K. Warder's Introduction to Pali, which provides in-depth instruction in Pali grammar without presupposing knowledge of Sanskrit, and is based entirely on the language of the early nikāyas (sutta collections). Grammatical concepts will be previewed and reinforced with exercises from Lily de Silva's Pali Primer, which are extremely accessible and enable rapid assimilation of basic structures. The reference text need not be purchased.

The basics of Pali grammar are covered in the first semester; the second semester is devoted to intermediate and advanced grammatical topics and readings. Evaluation is facilitated through periodic quizzes, a midterm, and a cumulative final exam. By the end of the first semester, students can expect to have a firm grasp of the basics of the language, a working vocabulary of roughly 600 words, and competency in reading standard prose passages with assistance.
