Course Description: Asaṅga's Mahāyānasaṅgraha (MSG) is one of the main texts summarizing the entire Buddhist path as understood by the Yogācāra school of Indian Buddhist thought. This course will be a reading of the text together with Nagao's commentary, in translation, and also supplementary readings as assigned; note: this is a change from earlier course description.

Readings are to be done in advance of class meetings.

Texts: translation of Nagao's commentary on the MSG, distributed Keenan's BDK translation—distributed free as gift from BDK other works and essays as assigned

Grading: class participation, final paper

Final Paper: topic of student's choice on Buddhist psychology or philosophy that is discussed in the MSG
